

MEN OF FLEET TO ENTER BIG TRACK MEET ON APRIL 10

Resident Entries To Close Today
But Sailors Will Be Al-
lowed More Time

MEN WANT CHANCE TO PRACTICE BASEBALL

Use of Moiliili Field During Week
Offered—Intra-Club Track
Tryouts Today

TWO intra-club track meets will be held today to decide upon entries for the annual A. A. U. track meet to be held on Alexander Field next Saturday afternoon. The Waikiki Athletic Club will hold trials in the various events on Damon Field this afternoon while the Outrigger Canoe Club athletes will be contesting among themselves on Alexander Field—a short distance away.

Each club has a large number of men available for the track meet and inasmuch as the rules limit the entries to four men per club in each event, tryouts were necessary to eliminate those athletes who would have little chance of winning in the big meet.

Invitations to enter the meet have been extended to the men of the Pacific Fleet by the Hawaiian A. A. U. through the commanding admiral. Entries for the meet are due to close this afternoon, but on account of the fact that the fleet has just arrived, it will be allowed the privilege of making post entries. The men of the fleet must, of course, enter unattached. What athletic material is to be found among the sailors is unknown, as a large portion of the crews is composed of recruits and the athletic officers have not had an opportunity to find out what the men can do.

There is considerable enthusiasm among the visitors about baseball and they are anxious to stretch their sea legs on a diamond. Accordingly the sailors have been offered the use of Moiliili Field by J. A. Beaven for practice purposes any time during the week except Saturdays and Sundays when civilian games are scheduled. Several of the destroyers have good baseball teams among their crews and the cruiser Brooklyn has the nucleus of a good team.
