**MELIM BACK IN FORM:
DOES 100 DASH IN 10 1-5**

Lindley Shows Well In High
Jump—Canario Strong
In Distances

THE Outrigger Club held its tryout for the Centennial Track meet on Alexander Field yesterday afternoon, and while no startling records were made, the team as a whole looked strong. Clifford Melim, Gilbert Canario, Douglas Crozier, George Lindley, Bill Leal, Harold Harvey and Mortimer Lydgate may be counted on as point winners next Saturday, judging by the form they showed yesterday.

Crozier was taking a day off so did not run his favorite races, the middle distances, but he entered the sprints. He did not exert himself in these races, but was able to breeze in second to Melim with ease. Had he let out he would have given Melim a good rub, especially in the 220.

Melim ran the hundred in 10 1-5 without being pressed and took the 60 yard event in 6 1-5. In the 220, he loafed for the first hundred yards and so his time was only 23 4-5, although he finished hard. In the 60-yard race Crozier was second with Poepe and McConnell practically a head heat for third. In the hundred Poepe, McConnell and Stickney were bunched in the order named some six yards behind Melim.

The quarter, half, and mile were not very sharply contested, for there were but two runners in each of these events. Stickney easily defeated Deverill in the 440 in 54 4-5, while Deverill did the same to Bryant in the 880 in 2 14 4-5. In the mile Canario won from Palmore in 5:21.

Bill Leal scored two first places; the 220 hurdles and the broad jump. In the hurdle race he cleared the sticks nicely and finished with a comfortable lead over Bryant in 28 flat. In the broad he jumped an even 20 feet and was easily the winner. Lindley came in second with a jump of 18 feet 9 inches, but Canario, who was third, lost credit for a jump of better than 19 feet by sticking his toe over the take-off board.

Good Mark In Jump

In the high jump, Lindley showed that it will take some jumper to beat him next week. He cleared 5 feet 8 inches easily, and missed 5 feet 10 by a narrow margin.

Canario beat Harvey out in the vault at 10 feet 6 inches. Campbell was third. Lindley did not arrive in time to enter this event. It is not certain whether Lindley will vault next Saturday or not.

Two heats were run in the high hurdles and "Mass-jaw" Canario finished first in both, making 18 2-5 each time.

Chris Willis, the Punahou sprinter, who was expected to run under Outrigger colors, did not show up for the tryouts, and it was rumored that he was "pau track" for the season.
