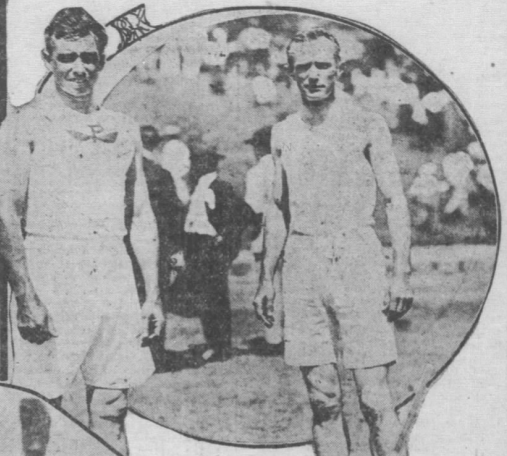


# SNAPPED AT THE A. A. U. TRACK MEET ON SATURDAY LAST
