

# Outrigger Grid Prospect Good Says Bill Inman

The Outrigger Canoe club football squad will commence practise early next month, according to a statement yesterday from Bill Inman, coach of the team. Although it may be too early to make any prediction, it looks, from the material that it is expected to turn out, as though Inman would be able to hammer out a fine bunch this fall. Many of last year's players are back again, and there is every chance of some new material proving good.

The line will be strong this year, as practically all the old men will be back. Anderson or Hart should hold up the center of the line, both being experienced players. There will be a number of candidates out for guard. Dave Kahanamoku played that position throughout last season and will be back there again. Morgan or King will be expected to take the other guard position, and Waldron and O'Sullivan will also be out for the job.

Carter Galt, Yale and All-American tackle, will take the right tackle and should be the strongest man on the Outrigger line. Galt played on the Yale team for three years and was one of their big stars. Von Holt is also a star tackle and should take the other side easily.

### Other Stars

Willie Thompson has been a star ever since he entered the game, and he is expected to take up the duties next fall. Thompson played on and captained the McKinley team, and was an All-Star end selection. Sam Fuller will take the other end, and these positions will be well taken care of with two such veteran players.

Allen McGuire, George Canario, or Colin Campbell will occupy the job of field general, unless some dark horse turns up. McGuire was one of Punahou's stars last year, and showed an ability to play quarter, which netted him that position on the All-Star eleven. Canario and Campbell are also old-timers. Ten candidates have signed up for the backfield, and all of them are veteran players.

Joe Stickney played for four years on the high school and is remembered as one of their greatest backs. Ted Searle was Punahou's star back last year, and should be a good man this season. Chris Willis, the Hollinger Brothers, Bryant, Hart and Andrews, will all help to make a strong backfield.
