

SOCCER YEAR FOR HONOLULU APPEARS PROMISING; LEAGUE MAY BE ADDED TO

New Teams Seek Admission For the Organization—Healani May Travel To Kauai

Although it is rumored that E. Parker, last season's captain of the championship Healani soccer team may be seen with another team this year, the boatmen are quite confident of turning out a team that will successfully defend their possession of the League Trophy.

Johnny Hollinger, one of the best local players in the League, has been secured and several other promising young players have been added to the list of Healani veterans, all of which assures a most formidable team. With Jimmy Greig, G. F. Lois and Jack Simpson directing the affairs of the team the outlook for a very successful season is indeed promising. Although negotiations have not been completed there is a strong possibility of the Healani team making a tour of Kauai early next year probably playing four games during the visit.
