

OUTRIGGERS CLEAN UP ELIOT'S GANG IN PRACTICE MEET ON VARSITY'S LOT

University Team Lacks Punch in
Contest With Surfriders
and Lose 15-0

The Outrigger football team defeated the University of Hawaii team yesterday afternoon on Cooke field, to the tune of 15 to 0. The game being only a scrimmage, field goals were not kicked. The scoring started in the first few minutes of play with a drop from the University thirty-five-yard line by Parker. The Outriggers outplayed their opponents in all stages of the game.

The University lacked the pep and drive, which may be partly due to the many scrimmages they have had this week. Their tackling was too high and the line was not holding as it should. On the other hand, the surf-riders' line held and went through without much trouble. This scrimmage certainly brought out the fact that the surf-riders can play, and that with speed. Sam Fuller was the outstanding man of the Outriggers on the line, and his fast work in getting down on punts and nailing the runner prevented the University from making what seemed to be long gains.

Parker Good

Parker, who quartered the outriggers, showed up remarkably well, with the score of the surf-riders all to his credit, a drop in the first few minutes of play from the thirty-five-yard line, a touchdown in the first quarter on a beautifully intercepted pass, and the other in the third quarter through the line from punt formation. Elinha Andrews was the big ground-gainer for the beach gang, for time and time he would skirt the ends and burst through the line for big gains. His punting was good and well placed.

The playing of the team in general was good, and the line had the charge and fight which instilled a great deal of pep into the team. For the college, there were no outstanding players, for all worked as one. Morty Lydgate did all of the punting, and he showed up well at his position on the line. The Outrigger line was much heavier than the University, and this told on the light varsity eleven. Mott-Smith played a good game on the line, with strong defensive play. The University will have to brace up considerably in order to stand up against the other teams of the league.
