

HARVARD AGAINST HARVARD WILL BE ORDER IN SUNDAY GAME AT MOILIILI

Withington and Gilman Will Play For Outrigger and the Waikiki Teams

When Greek meets Greek trouble ensues — so say the philosophers. When a football team coached in one school of play tackles another that has been trained in the same style of play — a tough party will be had by all, according to fans.

That is why the game next Sunday, between the Outriggers and the Waikikis, will be one of the most notable games of the season. Each team has been trained in the Harvard type of play, as introduced for the Crimson some dozen years ago by Percy Haughton. Each team, furthermore, has with it an eminent exponent of athletics from Harvard.

Famous Coaches

Outrigger has been coached this season by Dr. Paul Withington, noted oarsman and all-around athlete of the Cambridge university, while Atherton Gilman, All-American tackle and star of many hard-fought battles for the Harvard team, has been the guiding power of the Waikikis.

In the lineups on Sunday these two veterans will play opposite one another. Withington will be at tackle for the Surfriders and Gilman will be posted at end for the Waikikis. The two teams will play a similar game, the famous Harvard wedge being one unmistakable feature of the contest.

Under these circumstances, and in view of the fact that the rivalry between the two teams has been intense for the past two seasons, this game on Sunday should provide the utmost in football for the spectators.

Last year the Outriggers were beaten by Scotty Schuman's team, which was then the Town Team, but with the change of name to Waikiki this season the first named aggregation believes that a shifting of honors will take place.

At any rate at 3:30 o'clock on Sunday two heavy teams, brimful of the sort of rivalry that makes for a bitter struggle on the white-striped turf, will be the attraction that will draw all dyed-in-the-wool football fans to Moiliili field.
