

Major Civilian Grid League to Start Saturday

The major civilian football league of Oahu will open its season on Saturday afternoon. The second game of the schedule will take place on Sunday of the coming week-end.

There are four teams in the major league. They are University of Hawaii, Palama Settlement, Outrigger Canoe club and the Waikiki Athletic club.

On Saturday

The Saturday game will be between the University of Hawaii and the Palama Settlement club. The Palama team is rated as strong. It has two of the college's last year stars in Lionel "Dusky" Brash and George Bromley. Bromley has an injured shoulder and may not be able to take part in the opening game. The Palama team likewise has several other stars in Makalena, Mellm and Beagle. Beagle is a member of the air service at Luke Field and played with the Luke Field team last year. He is an excellent forward pass receiver and a hard man to stop.

The University of Hawaii has a light team that will have to depend on the forward pass for its ground gaining. It nevertheless has a number of stars, chief of whom is the quarterback, Bob Spencer. The varsity has found other stars in Charlie Lambert, Sonny Ruttman and Macconel. Both teams are fairly evenly matched and should put up a good opening game.

Sunday Game

The second game of the league series will be played Sunday when the Outriggers meet the Waikikis at Mollili. These two elevens are exceedingly strong and each has a Harvard football captain. The Waikikis have Atherton Gilman, while the Outriggers have Paul Withington.

The Outriggers will also have a tower of strength in Chester Langenstein of Northwestern University, who coached the Kamehameha school team this year.

The Waikikis have Fred Galligan, formerly of Swanee, and Vanderbilt. Galligan is regarded as one of the trickiest broken field runners in the islands.
