

# GILMAN, SCHUMAN, WAC COMBINATION TOO MUCH FOR OUTRIGGER ELEVEN

## Surfriders Downed By 14 To 7 Score In Weirdest Game of the Season—First Two Scores Were Freak Affairs

Atherton Gilman, Scotty Schuman, the Harvard style of play as developed by these two, et al, proved to be too much for the Outriggers yesterday afternoon at Moiliili Field, and the result was a 14 to 7 score for the Waikiki aggregation.

The outstanding features of the day were the spectacular manner in which the first two touchdowns were made, and the brilliancy of the performance of Atherton Gilman, former all American tackle.

Gilman ranged from one side of the line to the other; he was at the base of every play and was good opposition for any two men on his side of the line; his kicking was excellent, his interference impregnable, and his manipulation of his team most effective; and in addition to this he was a steady performer in the breaking up of forward passes, tackling on long chances, and tearing through the line. It was undoubtedly his day.

### First Score

The first touchdown was made in the second quarter when Waikiki had the ball at the Outrigger five yard line. A forward pass was attempted which was intercepted by Parker who streaked down the field, with the Waikiki pack close at his heels, for a run of about ninety seven yards to a perfect touchdown. Withington kicked the goal.

Waikiki scored in third quarter when something went wrong in the Outrigger receiving system. The ball was about in the center of the field and the center snapped it back. There was no one to receive it. Kanohi was on the ball as soon as it had hit the ground and was off in line style for a sixty-yard run that scored the touchdown, which in turn was followed by Gilman's kick-in of the goal.

Waikiki's next score was made in the final quarter after Gilman had smashed up an end run that Outrigger tried to put over while the ball was well up under their goal posts. Outrigger kicked for from behind the line, Gilman leaped in the air, blocked the kick and Rodriguez snugged the ball for a touchdown. Gilman kicked the goal.

Waikiki's honors were hard earned, and were due in great part to the performances of Mac Ross, Rodriguez and Pat O'Sullivan. Outrigger's heavy work was done by Andrews, Parker, Withington, and, in the latter part of the game, Futy and Campbell.

Mac Ross, at quarter during the first portion of the game, put up a splendid exhibition of guinness in the face of heavier opposition and his activities were stopped only after he had been tackled with smashing force by Withington. In the last quarter,

Upon all in all the Waikiki played a better game than their opponents, especially in the last of the game when the battle went all their way. They were continually playing in Outrigger's territory and had little difficulty in keeping their own goal clear of any danger. In kicking the teams were well matched with a bit of the latter of it going to Gilman.

Back Aaron, Waikiki's fullback, was not in the game, he having been ill for the past few days.

### The Game

Waikiki kicked off, Gilman punted to Hollinger who ran it back for twenty yards. Andrews punted out beyond the goal posts at the Waikiki end of the lot. Outrigger was shortly faced five yards on an offense. Waikiki was sent in for an end run, with no effect so far as gain went, but the play served to demonstrate the strength of the Outrigger defensive plan. Gilman kicked out of bounds at the forty-five-yard line. Andrews and Hollinger each gained three yards on line attacks. After an incomplete forward pass, Andrews punted for a gain of forty-five yards for Outrigger, although Waikiki took the ball. Waikiki was next penalized fifteen yards for holding. Gilman punted out to Parker who luckily recovered his own fumble in time to save the ball. Hollinger ripped through the line for ten yards advance. Outrigger fumbled and Waikiki recovered the ball. Gilman went through for a five-yard gain. Gilman punted high and long in the Outrigger twenty-five yard line. Mac Ross snugged Outrigger's punt and ran it back for twenty yards. Waikiki tried line plunges away from Withington who had been an obstacle of solidarity in their progress when the play was put on him. Outrigger held firmly. Gilman punted again in the Outrigger fifteen-yard line. Mac Ross ran back the Outrigger kick-out for ten yards. Waikiki tried a forward pass that was intercepted by Hollinger who ran it back until snugged by Thurston on the 25-yard line. The next play of this sort, by Outrigger was stopped short by Thurston although it was completed neatly. Waikiki used a wedge play for a short gain. Parker recovered Gilman's punt and Bill Hollinger gained seven yards on a fake double pass. Outrigger on the fourth down failed to make distance, by about 5 feet. Gilman punt at 100. Outrigger punted out to Mac Ross who followed it down but lost the ball on the hundred. The scores ended.

### Outrigger Scores

Outrigger opened the second quarter with line plays. On their fourth down they were penalized for an offense. A few seconds later they were penalized another 15 yards for holding. They fumbled the snap and it was recovered by Waikiki on the 30-yard line. Parker fumbled Gilman's punt, and Crabbe recovered for Waikiki on the 15-yard line. Outrigger stood firm against two hard attacks at the line. Crabbe ripped through the line for all but one yard of the ten yards required

for the four downs. He made the distance on the next smash by about three inches. He was then sent around the end, but gained no distance. With the ball on the five-yard line and with a score for Waikiki almost a certainty, Parker intercepted a forward pass in beautiful style and returned down the field for a touchdown. Withington kicked the goal. Score, 7 to 0.

Kahanamoku took Gilman's punt for a run back of 20 yards, with a pack of Waikiki hanging on him like ticks on a poodle pup. Andrews broke through for seven yards more. Outrigger then lost the ball on an uncompleted forward pass. Gilman punted out of bounds, and Outrigger got the ball on their 25-yard line. Mac Ross pulled a brilliant end run for a small gain. Galigan stopped another attempted advance on the end by the Surfriders, who tried another end run with no gain. Outrigger punted to Mac Ross, who was downed and lost the ball. Withington scooped the pigskin from the ground and advanced seven yards, carrying a heavy load of Waikiki with him. Parker was taken out and replaced by Campbell.

### Second Half

Lead went in for Galigan in the Waikiki backfield. The kickoff flew to him and he ran the play back 20 yards before being tackled. Then came the play that gave the Waikiki their first score. Outrigger called for the formation for a center pass, and when the hand was snapped there was no one on hand to receive it. It plunked to the ground and the line went backing bravely in. Kanohi grabbed the leather and dived 60 yards down the field for a touchdown. Gilman kicked a neat goal. Score, 7 to 7.

Gilman punted to the 20-yard line. On the next play Crabbe carried a recovered forward pass five yards before he was downed. Outrigger paid out five yards for an offense. Waikiki was penalized 15 yards for holding. Gilman punted and Rodriguez made the gain good by a spectacular tackle. Outrigger lost ground on an attempted end run. Outrigger's punt was blocked. The next one gave them a 20-yard gain that carried the battle to the center of the field. Outrigger was penalized five yards for an offense. Mac Ross gained five by slipping partly through and partly under the line. Waikiki was charged 15 yards for holding. Outrigger punted, and only a thrilling step by Mac Ross prevented a good gain and the probable loss of the ball for Waikiki. Mac Ross passed to Thurston for a 15-yard gain. The quarter ended with the Waikiki having all the best of it.

The first of the last quarter opened with a calamity for Mac Ross, when he was tackled by Withington. The former was carried off the field with a



bad knee. A little while later Outrigger tried to get around the end. The whistle blew and all was peaceful until Withington took the ball and ran down the field for what purported to be a touchdown. Hot argument arose in the field. In the meantime Withington was safely unscathed behind the goal posts, firmly clutching the ball. He was called to bring the ball back to the center of the field, but seemed reluctant to do so. Finally he was persuaded that all was well and that no one on the Waikiki team was trying to slip anything over on him, and the pigskin appeared on the scene of action once more. Much argument took place and plenty of uncomplimentary comment from the grandstand and bleachers.

Another hot discussion was held a few minutes later, when Gilman's team tried a forward pass which was intercepted. Gilman then dashed in and grabbed the ball and the runner. When the whistle blew both men were standing up with a half-nelson on the ball. The umpire called it an incomplete forward pass, and the field in general howled, some with satisfaction and others with rage. Umpa had his way, and the ball was carried back down the field, once more relieving the strain on the Outrigger goal. Waikiki forced the play to the three-yard line, where Gilman, after Outrigger had obtained the ball, broke up an attempted end run with a smashing tackle. Outrigger spread back of the line and tried to kick out. Gilman leaped in the air, blocked the ball, and Rodriguez scored a touchdown for the Waikiki. Gilman kicked. Score, 14 to 7, in favor of Waikiki.

The rest of the game was a bitter struggle. Mayhem, lurrantry, sabotage and general manslaughter were mild compared to the shuffling struggle put up by the rival elevens. As time passed on Outrigger tried for "hook plays," but none of them matured. No further scores were made. The attendance was excellent, in spite of the rain that undoubtedly kept many away from the field by its appearance in the early afternoon. All was orderly, and the Outriggers had passed eggs to drink from. The score should have been 7 to 0 in favor of the Waikiki. If there are such things as breaks, nobody could claim them exclusively.
