

SURF-RIDERS PUT IT OVER UNIVERSITY BY ONE FIELD GOAL IN SATURDAY'S GAME

Preceded by a sensational 35-yard run by Joe Stickney through a broken field around left end which gave his team the ball on the enemy's 30-yard mark, and after three attempts to puncture the varsity line had failed, Quarterback Campbell won the game for the Outrigger eleven against the University of Hawaii Saturday afternoon at Moiliili field when he booted a field goal from the 40-yard line, the score being the only one of the day.

The chart of the contest shows that the varsity men excelled practically in every department of the scramble. The sensational long runs of the fight were made by Joe Stickney of the Surfriders. Searle and Conant of the varsity scored heavily for needed yardage by pretty short runs of 10 and 12 yards.

The Score

The score came in the second quarter. With a Manoa wind whipping down the field, Campbell's kick was difficult. When the oval left the ground, it sailed high in the air and just breezed over the bar a few inches inside the right pole.

Coach Elliot's men had a chance to win the fray in the final quarter when Bob Spencer brought his crew to the Outrigger territory within 40 yards of the goal posts. Here two forward passes went wild. The third pass was nerve-wrecking. Kinney ran back with the ball. Looking ahead of him, he spotted Thompson and Spencer in the distance and he hurled the ball in between the two, but the throw was too speedy for either one to handle, thus losing Hawaii's big chance for a victory.

Questioned

A five-minute argument halted the game during the opening of the last quarter when Hawaii was forced to punt on the Outrigger's 40-yard line. The ball was kicked high, and when it dropped on the 10-yard line it bounced and rolled slowly toward the goal. Jimmie Hart of the Beachcombers dashed for the ball, his body crossing the post line near the pigskin. Johnny Thompson pocketed the ball and it looked like a touchdown on a fumble. Umpire Midkiff ruled it a touchback, stating that Hart touched the ball when it was out of bounds.

Capt. Willnorman King of the Green opened the game by kicking off against the wind to the Outrigger's 15-yard line. A series of bucks and end runs by both sides coupled with an exchange of punts brought no results. Joe Stickney's long end run of 30 yards was the only exciting play in this quarter.

Making his way down the field with a 35-yard dash in the second period, Joe Stickney left the ball on Hawaii's 30-yard line. Three runs for first down failed and Campbell hopped back 10 yards and made a drop kick of 40 yards successfully

for three points. This came with four minutes left to play, so ends the half.

Second Half

Hawaii opened up the second half by halting the heavy Withington line for a total of three straight firstdowns. But all chances died again when King failed to score on a place kick from the 45-yard mark. The ball went under the bars.

The third quarter did not figure much in the line of playing. It was mostly punting, with Lydgate showing the superior knowledge and strength over Campbell and Andrews. A 20-yard run by Conant was the longest distance gained in this 12 minutes of play.

Final Period

Coach Withington sent in a string of new men for his team, and he himself went in the backfield in the final period. An intercepted forward pass by Slade, who made 25 yards by trotting down the field, gave hope for more points on the canoe paddlers' part. But good tackling and a stiff defense against the winners stopped many plays which looked like long ground gainers.

Hawaii sent in Kinney on the backfield and used him for hurling forward passes. He hurled the pigskin three times and failed to score. One shot went for 25 yards, which Spencer and Thompson both could not reach, and which, if caught, would have been good for a touchdown.
