

OUTRIGGERS DEFEAT PALS AND WIN RIGHT TO TACKLE NEVADA ON NEW YEAR'S DAY

It was a wild wrestling match of a football game which the Outriggers and Palamas staged at Mollisill field yesterday afternoon. The Outriggers won, 31 to 7, and by the victory practically gained the right to meet the University of Nevada gang New Year's day.

From the standpoint of unexpected thrills, queer twists of football and good hard fight, it was a real game and while the score indicates a one-sided proposition, the Palama team put up a hard fight.

The line was the strong point of the Surfers, getting under way more quickly than the Palamas and seemingly capable of holding long enough for the powerful Outrigger offensive backfield to get under way.

It was not until the end of the third quarter that Palama was able to score and then not by way of the line but through a series of forward passes which saved the Pals from a whitewashing.

The Game

The first quarter was uneventful, each team feeling out the weak points of the other. The period was marred by several fumbles. In the second quarter, the Outrigger ma-

chine got under way, the line stiffened and the ball was steadily worked down the field into Palama territory. The Pals got panicky and fumbled. A punt went wide and the ball was Outrigger property close to the goal line. Three downs were required to take the leather over. Hart made the touchdown. Withington kicked goal.

After the kickoff, Outrigger made better time and following two runs by Hoopii, a pass to Searle and two line plunges brought the ball to the 15 yard line. Hoopii carried it close to the goal and then took it over in a squeeze through the line. Withington kicked goal. The half ended with the score 14 to 0.

Third Quarter

Early in the third quarter Outrigger piled up another counter when Searle received the kick-off and ran it back for 39 yards. Stickney made distance on the first down and then smashed through and was away on a 40 yard run which took the ball over the goal line. Withington again kicked goal.

After the kickoff, Sam Hipa slipped over to the side line and got away with a beautiful forward pass. Outrigger was off guard and

the Pals made 50 yards on the play, two passes were discounted, one on a penalty and the other incomplete. Brash slipped a short pass to S. Hipa who glided over the line for Palama's lone count. Goal was made by a narrow margin. The score stood 21 to 7.

Fight Hard

Fighting hard, the Palamas prevented another assault on their goal line a few minutes after the kickoff. Searle grabbed a forward pass and made 25 yards. After a scrimmage in which the Palama line refused to budge, Searle dropped the leather between the posts from the 34 yard line for a field goal.

The last score came when Palama punted out from their seven yard line. Andrews and Hart brought it back 20 yards and a long high pass from Slade to Bryant gave the Outriggers another touchdown. Withington kicked goal.

From here on Outrigger rested its case and merely held the fighting Palama team, who made a good attempt at a come back but were unsuccessful.
