

GILMAN AND BRASH ASKED TO PLAY OUTRIGGERS TO ENTER STRONG SET FANS FAVOR LATEST GRID ACTION

J. Atherton Gilman, Harvard and All-American tackle of 1915, and Lionel ("Dusky") Brash, last year College of Hawaii player, have been requested to play with the Outrigger Canoe club team next Saturday at Alexander Field at Punahou, against the University of Nevada eleven which defeated the University of Hawaii Christmas Day.

It is known that Gilman has agreed to play and it is expected that Brash, providing his work does not interfere, will also be delighted to perform in order to help Hawaii get at least one victory over the visitors.

Invited

Honolulu football fans who saw the game Christmas Day and who have heard of the intention of the Outrigger Canoe club to invite Gilman and Brash to play New Year's Day are loud in praise of the idea. They point out that it will not only give Hawaii a stronger team for the final game, but it will also do a great deal toward bringing greater harmony into local gridiron circles. Emphasis is laid on the fact that both Gilman and Brash are local boys, born and raised in the islands, and hence in no sense of the word "outsiders" in any way.

Fred C. Bailey, manager of the Outrigger Canoe club, after a consultation with Dr. Paul Withington, coach and player on the team, announced this morning that Gilman and Brash had been invited to take part in the game next Saturday. His statement, on the matter is as follows:

Statement

"As manager of the Outrigger Canoe club, which has won the distinction of being chosen to represent Hawaii against the Nevada university in the second and final game on New Year's Day, I want to say that I have invited Lionel Brash, captain and all-around player of the Palamas, and J. Atherton Gilman, captain of the Waikkis, ex-captain of Harvard and all-American tackle, to help us represent the islands in this coming game.

"I feel that both of these men have the right to represent Hawaii against Nevada which is invading us, so to speak, for both were born in the islands, and therefore are defenders of Hawaii's fair name. I may be strongly criticized by some for this action on the grounds that since the Outriggers won the right, none out Outrigger players should play on the team against Nevada. On the other hand I have been strongly urged by members of the committee which has the handling of the Nevada games, to put the strongest possible team in the field New Year's Day.

The Reason

"Having this in mind and the fact that the Outrigger team has just finished a most strenuous season of games against the best local football teams and that some of our best men have been badly crippled in these games, I do not want to be put in the position of having the Outrigger team play through another whole hard game while good local men such as Gilman and Brash, whom I believe would be of great help, standing on the side lines.

"The playing of these two men will not break up the machine work of the Outrigger team, developed this season by Doctor Withington, but will strengthen the eleven on the whole, as one player (Gilman) is a linesman and the other (Brash) is a backfield man.

"Doctor Withington supports me in these contentions, as do others of the team with whom I have had an opportunity of discussing this matter. The Outrigger club does not want to be considered small and petty in the matter, and that is one of the main reasons why we are opening our ranks to give Hawaii's best a chance to uphold Hawaii's fair name against the invaders."

Strong

With the additions of Gilman and Brash, the Outrigger team will be one of the most formidable, if not the most formidable, ever turned out. With Gilman on one side of the line and Withington on the other the Outrigger line will be a stone wall. With Brash in the backfield the Outrigger will have just the necessary man for running back punts and making long forward passes. In fact the Outrigger team will be truly representative of Hawaii's best gridiron warriors. That is the opinion of fans who follow the local game closely.
