

# Neither Outrigger Nor Nevada Will Gallop Off With Honors

## New Year's Day Contest Will Have To Be Won By Hard Scrapping: Outrigger Is Stronger, While Nevada Has Tricks In Store

That Atherton Gilman will be the only addition to the ranks of the Outrigger team on New Year's Day for the Nevada game, is the general belief of football fans here. Lionel (Dusky) Brash, who has been invited to play as one of the stars of the Palama aggregation, will not participate, so it is generally believed, on account of the tragic death of his brother on Christmas day.

This arrangement, if it goes as it stands, will mean that there will be new strength in the Outrigger line without the weakening that might result from having a man, no matter how brilliant a player, in the line up who had not been playing the Outrigger style of play this season.

Gilman, while playing with the Waikikis this season, and acting as coach to that aggregation, is a member of the Outrigger Club and has been working his team out on the same lines as those adopted by Coach Withington of the Outriggers.

There is every reason to believe that the difference in weight between the Outriggers and the University of Hawaii will make a vast difference, and perhaps a detrimental one, to Nevada's play. There is, however, no foundation for the overenthusiasm of many of the local fans, who declare that with Gilman and Withington in the line and Searle and Hoopii in the backfield, the Outriggers will trounce the visitors with no difficulty.

### Some Saved Up

It is safe to say that Nevada did not open and dump out its entire bag of tricks for the benefit of the crowd at the Christmas Day game. Jimmy Bradshaw is bright enough, and veteran enough, to hold a little in reserve for just such occasions, especially in view of the fact that there was no great need for anything except line bucks, that crisscross pass and Bradshaw's sturdy legs to defeat Hawaii on Saturday. Accordingly the fan who says flat-footedly that the New Year's game will be a walk over for the Surf-riders is taking in a lot of territory.

And on the other hand, as teacher used to apply the ruler, the Reno cohorts do not want to get the idea that they are wading into the old soldiers home on the first day of the new year, just because some of the stars of the Outrigger team are solid business men. Business men as well as college students and prep school boys, have the faculty of going in for their favorite sports here in Hawaii, and when they go in they do it for all they're worth.

Nevada will find the Outrigger line heavier, and probably harder to handle than the University of Hawaii first year, and the combination of Searle and Hoopii in the back field is apt to prove as troublesome to the visitors as it was to the Palamas the other day.

The only inference to be drawn, therefore, is that the New Year game will be the biggest drawing card ever staged in these Islands, and that the fans will see another game as hard fought, if not even more so, than the one at Alexander Field last Saturday afternoon.
