A. U. PLAN

There will be three divisions in the A. A. U. Volleyball league this year. The Seniors will be made up of teams having players of eighteen years or more of age. The Junior teams will be made up of players under eighteen, while the midgets will be lads up to and including fifteen year olders.

At the meeting of the A. A. U. held yesterday five clubs were represented. The five were Palama, Hui Makani, Healani, Outrigger and Hilo. It was decided that only Clubs affiliated with the A. A. U. would be allowed to enter teams that all players must be bonafide registered performers of strictly amateur status.

A letter will be sent out by the Secretary of the A. A. U. asking all teams so desiring to sign up before the closing of the entries on April 18. At noon on that day, at the office of E. Fullard-Lee, secretary of the A. A. U. formal closing of the entry lists will take place.

Rules for volleyball this year will be the 1920 regulations of the A. A. U. and all contests will be staged under these rules.

Women May Play

In view of the fact that several of the athletic clubs of the community have affiliated bodies of women athletes, it is intended to arrange for a volleyball league for the latter, not for public play but on the club courts. Hui Makani, Women's Auxiliary of the Outrigger club, Outrigger Girls' club, and Palama Girls' club will probably be represented.
