

PADDLERS SHOW SOME SPEED IN SURFBOARD TILTS

Seven Events Staged At Waikiki; Winners Given Medals Following Races

Surfboard paddling races, once a popular local sport, were revived at the Outrigger Canoe Club today under the auspices of a committee of members which plans to make them an annual event in the future. Seven fast races were run and medals will be awarded the winners.

The revival of the races is along new lines with a view to placing the racers entirely dependent upon their own ability and speed, and not giving them the advantage of the surf, as in the past. Today's course was parallel to the beach. The men's open race was from Gray's raft to a point in the water opposite the Outrigger clock. The other races were from a point off the Seaside hotel to the same finish line.

More than 100 persons saw the races. If the revival plan proves successful, other aquatic clubs will be invited to participate in the annual events.
