

ELEVEN CLUBS WILL COMPETE ON SATURDAY

**McKinley Not Entering Due
To Hilo Invasion; Place
Taken By National Guards**

More than 225 athletes, representing a total of 11 clubs, are entered in the Rainbow relay carnival which will be held a week from today at Kamehameha field. The entry lists for the meet closed this morning.

The list of the clubs which have entered the meet is as follows:

Outrigger, Palamas, University of Hawaii, Coast Defenses of Honolulu, Schofield, Fort Kamehameha, Marines, Police, Kamehameha School, Y. M. C. A. and National Guard.

McKinley Athletic Association was to have entered, but owing to the fact that quite a number of the Mick stars have gone to Hilo for a track meet it has been decided not to come in. The National Guard is a last minute entry.

The work of tabulating the entries is keeping Victor Ligda, A. A. U. secretary, busy today.

The list of events for the Rainbow Relay Carnival follows:

Events

(1) 1/4 mile relay—four men running 110 yards each, (2) 1/2 mile relay—four men running 220 yards each, (3) one mile relay—four men running 440 yards each, (4) two mile relay—four men running 880 yards each, (5) four mile relay—four men running one mile each, (6) 220 yard low hurdles, (7) 120 yard hurdles, (8) 100 yard dash "novice," (9) discus, (10) javelin, (11) hammer, (12) shot put, (13) broad jump, (14) high jump, (15) pole vault.

Prizes

Six cups will be awarded, one to the team winning the meet and one to the winning team in each relay event. These trophies will be in the nature of challenge cups, and shall be retained for one year by the winning team. A team winning any cup three times will retain permanent possession of it.

In addition gold medals will be awarded to each member of the winning relay teams.

Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded for first, second and third place respectively in the individual events.

The cups and medals are now on display in the window of the Honolulu Sporting Goods Co. store on Hotel and Fort Sts.
