

# Burton Hooper Is Drawing Card For Rainbow Relays; Has Been Doing Near 4:30

Won Diamond Head Race Recently; Half Mile Relay Record For Islands Made By 25th Infantry May Fall Next Saturday; Relay Entries Are Given

Burton Hooper, the "Paavo Nurmi of Hawaii," is one of the big drawing cards for the Rainbow Relays Carnival, to be staged Saturday at Kamehameha field under the auspices of the University of Hawaii. Hooper, who won the Diamond Head cross-country run, will run anchor on the Outrigger Canoe Club's four-mile relay team. Stop-watches will be clicked on his mile for Hooper has been doing the distance consistently in 4:30 flat while the Hawaiian record is about 10 seconds more than that.

Hooper came here some time ago from San Francisco where he won the Dipsea race and other coast classics. He has been training hard and this will be his first appearance as a local club runner. His other performances here have been as an unattached athlete.

The rest of the Outrigger Canoe Club entries for the four-mile relay are fairly strong and if they manage to hold up their end against the other teams Hooper is certain to win out in the last mile.

One record which may tumble Saturday is that of the half mile relay set by the 25th Infantry at 1:32 1-5. This has been standing for years but the Punahou relay team did the half mile at the Interscholastic meet on a wet track in 1:35 flat. Three of the members of the Punahou team, Bill

Jones, Ray Melim and Herbert Deverill are on the Outrigger squad. Besides that the Outrigger have for that event Gordon ("Dog") May, who was a Punahou star some years ago. Then there is A. Giles and B. Farden as well.
