

Track and Field Stars Perform on Kam Track Today in Rainbow Meet

Outriggers, Pals and Varsity to Compete in Three-cornered Fight for Relay Honors at Kam Field

THE Rainbow Relay Carnival—the Penn Relays of Hawaii—will take the center of the stage this afternoon at Kamehameha field. The cream of Hawaii's track and field athletes will answer the call of the announcer today and the cinder fans will flock to the Kalihi track to witness the first of what is hoped to be the annual track classic of the territory.

Three squads will be centered in a fight for high honors today. Otto Klum's Varsity, Jack Slade's Outrigger club and Wallace Saffrey's Palama squad are the favorites in today's meet. All three have strong combinations entered and the meet should be a bitter struggle from first event to last. The Deans placed the most men at the trials Thursday and are slight favorites to cop the majority of individual points over Palama and Outrigger.

But the O. C. C. gang will send fast relay combines to the starts and it may be this factor which will decide the winner of the Rainbow Carnival today. The Varsity will have strong sprint relay teams, but is considered weak in the longer races. Palama is well balanced and will give the beach club lots of competition.

The Outrigger club half mile, mile and four mile teams are looked upon as favorites while the Palama two mile and four mile teams have created no little talk on the downtown corners. The outrigger club will have a big advantage in the four mile relay with Burt Hooper as anchor man. The Varsity quarter mile relay quartet is favored to cop but both Palama

and O. C. C. will be well represented. As in no other meet, the Rainbow Carnival presents a problem to the dopesters which is near impossible to solve.

A host of well known track and field event stars will be in the individual event finals today. John Morse and John Watt will battle it out in the high hurdles while Eddie Fernandez, Ray Melim and Morse are among the finalists in the lows. Herman Clarke will be out to send the shot put record skyrocketing again and Capt. R. G. Lehman of the Wolfhound stables will be a potential factor in the discus event. Dick Gartley and Harold Harvey look good in the pole vault while Mel Carter should cop the high jump. All in all today's meet should be one of the best track offerings ever staged on local cinders.

The meet is scheduled for 1:30 p. m. today at Kamehameha field.
