

PLANS COMPLETED FOR SURFBOARD RACES ON FRIDAY

Heavy Entry List For Events To Be Staged In the Wai- kiki Canal

Everything is in readiness for the Hawaiian championship surfboard paddling races to be held in the canal at 9:30 a. m. New Year's Day.

There is a heavy entry list in all events and the records that will be established at this meet should be hard to beat in the future annual events of this kind. As the events are open to all, the winners will naturally be heralded as champions in the various distances in which they compete.

Considerable interest has been aroused also among fans who will undoubtedly fill the banks of the canal. No admission of any kind is being charged and spectators may drive right to the edge of the canal and view the sports in comfort from their autos.

The program consists of the following seven events which will be run off in snappy rotation so that the entire meet should not last more than one hour:

Half-mile men's open; quarter-mile women's open; quarter-mile for boys under 18; 100-yard men's open; 220-yard girls' novice; 220-yard boys under 16; three-quarter mile club relay, men (six men, each paddling 220 yards).

Keen rivalry is being displayed by the two beach clubs, the Hui Nalu and Outrigger, especially in the relay event. In this event each club will be represented by six paddlers who will cover a distance of 220 yards each.

As the distances are all surveyed and will be timed accurately, correct records will be established. These will be something then for paddlers in future races to "shoot at."
