

Outrigger Club Makes Ready For Big Celebration

Twentieth Anniversary To Be Observed With Lively Program

Plans were complete today for the celebration by the Outrigger Canoe club tomorrow afternoon and night of its 20th anniversary with a program of sports and festivities which begins at 2 a. m. and ends at midnight.
