

NAME OFFICIALS TO HANDLE MEET ON THANKSGIVING

Order of Events For Annual Outrigger Castle Swims Is Established

Negotiations are under way in an effort to bring the champion surfboard paddler of California to Hawaii to participate in the annual surfboard races held on the Alawai on New Year's day.

Announcement to this effect was made last night at a meeting held at the Outrigger Canoe club at which plans for the surfboard races and also for the annual Thanksgiving Day Castle swims were discussed.

The movement to have the California champion come here was started by Los Angeles swim officials who wrote to George D. (Dad) Center asking for his assistance in the matter. Center and other Outrigger club officials are trying to work out a means of financing the proposition.

The chief item of business taken up at last night's meeting was the making of final arrangements for the Castle swims to be held next Thursday under the auspices of the Outrigger club.

The Officials

The order of events was agreed upon and the following officials were named to handle the meet:

Starter—Theodore (Pump) Searle.

Clerks of course—A. E. Minvielle, Sr., and A. E. Minvielle, Jr.

Scorer—R. Raymond.

Reporter—W. G. Haglund.

Judges—Sam Sterritt, A. F. Bauman, Ted Smith and C. Livingston.

Timers—Roy A. Vitousek, C. Benny, Gay Harris, Louis F. Stephens, William B. McLean, Lorrin Thurston and R. K. Thomas.

It was decided to anchor an outrigger canoe a short distance from shore opposite the Outrigger club, this canoe to mark the finish of all races. The swimmers will be required to touch the canoe at the finish. The canoe will have a mast and the Outrigger club flag will fly from the mast so that the swimmers will have no trouble locating the finish.

Arrange Program

A program was worked out and it is believed that the races will be run off much faster than in past years. Outrigger canoes driven by outboard motors will be used to take the timers and other officials to the finish line after each race is started.

The races will be run off as follows: The Cunha swim for boys under 16 and the Cunha girls' novice swim will be started first.

The next races to be started will be the public baths swim for boys under 18, the public baths swim for women and the public baths swim for men over 30. The final and feature race of the day will be the castle swim for men.
