

EXPECT SEASON TO BE BIGGEST ON RECORD HERE

Clubs Invited To Send Representatives To Meeting At Nuuanu 'Y'

Plans for the 1929 track and field meets to be conducted here under the auspices of the Hawaiian Association of the A. A. U. will be laid at a meeting of officials to be held at the Nuuanu Y. M. C. A. at 7:30 p. m. on Tuesday, February 5.

The meeting has been called by E. C. Corn, chairman of the track and field committee of the A. A. U., who requests the support of all clubs in arranging the biggest program that has been carried out here in this branch of sports.

Corn has sent out letters to organizations interested in track and field, inviting them to send representatives to the meeting next Tuesday. While no definite dates have been set for the A. A. U. championships and other big meets the opinion of most of the coaches seems to be that the meets should be held in May instead of in April, as in past years. The reason for this is that it will give the athletes a longer training period.

Army and navy officials have expressed interest in the track and field program and indications are that there will be strong teams in the field representing both branches of the service.
