

# OUTRIGGERS DROP DECIDING MATCH OF SERIES 4 TO 0

Hui Nalu "Black" Take First Game of Junior Series; Members of Championship Hui Nalu Team Receive Individual Cups From Royal Hawaiian Hotel

**H**UI NALU surfboard poloists annexed the local championship at the Beach at Waikiki yesterday afternoon when they blanked the Outrigger Canoe club team 4 to 0 in the deciding game of the titular series for the Royal Hawaiian Hotel trophies. The championship contest was waged on a rough fairway before a very enthusiastic gathering.

In the junior game for the Frederick Soldwedel trophy, the Hui Nalu "Blacks" defeated the "Golds" 2 to 1, to grab the first game on the best two-out-of-three series.

## OUTRIGGERS OFF COLOR

While the Hui Nalu boys were in exceptionally good form for the deciding conflict, their beach neighbors were decidedly off color and failed to exhibit the fight and team work which characterized their exhibition last Sunday when they took the Hui Nalu down the line 3 to 1.

The rest half ended 2 to 0 in favor of the Hui Nalu. The first five minutes was devoted to warming up. Tom Kiskona soon got loose and took a pass from Sam Kahanamoku which he hurled through the uprights for the initial score of the day. Both teams battled for another five minutes, most in Outrigger territory, before Sam Kahanamoku registered again for the Hui Nalu after a brilliant dribbled the length of the field. There was no further scoring in the half and period ended with Sam Kahanamoku's riding and control of the ball as the outstanding feature of the period.

## JOHN D. SHINES

In the second half, the Hui Nalu again did all the offensive work. However, the outstanding feature of the period was the goal work of John De Kaupiko, Jr. The hefty Hui Nalu goalie showed in several beautiful saves in the dying minutes of the battle, and although these thrust would not have given the Outriggers the verdict, they would have made it a much closer game.

After two minutes of play in the second chapter, Sergeant Kahanamoku registered on a pass some nine minutes later, then the Hui Nalu took the defensive while the Outriggers threatened several times but goalie, John De Kaupiko, was too strong and the game closed down with the canoe boys on the short end.

## TROPHIES PRESENTED

After the match, the Hui Nalu players gathered near the promenade of the Royal Hawaiian Hotel where they were presented with individual loving cups donated by the hotel. Arthur Bengalis, general manager of the Territorial Hotels and Maurice "Jaffy" Flynn, director of sports at the Royal Hawaiian participated in the presentation which was witnessed by a huge throng.

## JUNIORS GET GOING

The juniors finally came to a decision in their series. For two weeks the Hui Nalu "Blacks" and "Golds" have battled to ties. Yesterday, Malcolm Paoa, opened the scoring for the "Golds" after one minute of play. Colgate Naval came back seven minutes later with a score for the "Blacks" that tied the score. Two minutes later, Freckles Lyons of the "Blacks" registered what turned out to be the winning goal of the game.

Colgate Naval, Kino Guerrero and Freckles Lyons were the outstanding players for the "Blacks" while Malcolm Paoa, Fly Richards and Blackshaw Paia featured for the "Golds." Captain Babe Carter of the "Golds" was out of the game yesterday due to an injury. Willie Whittle of the Hui Nalu Seniors was out of the lineup with a bad shoulder.
