The fourth annual city-wide swimming meet, open to all boys and girls, is scheduled for the Waikiki War Memorial natatorium March 20 at 3 p. m. and March 22 at 7:30 p. m.

These monster children's swimming meets are sponsored by the recreation commission, of which Mrs. F. M. Swanzy is chairman, and by the commission swimming committee, C. Dudley Pratt, chairman.

This year the meet is a feature of "Health Week," March 17-23.

The events scheduled for March 20 are for children under 13 years of age, while on March 22 events include boys and girls under 18 years of age.
