

SEVEN TEAMS IN A.A.U. VOLLEYBALL RACE APRIL 16

Secondary League Organized With Eight Teams Entered; Cup Offered

There will be seven teams in the senior A. A. U. volleyball league this year, the race of which is being slated to start on April 16, it was announced this morning by Floyd S. Field, chairman of the volleyball committee of the Hawaiian Association A. A. U.

The teams entered are: Outrigger Canoe club, Palama Settlement (last year champions), All-Firemen, Central Y. M. C. A., All-Around Chinese Athletes, Nuuanu Y. M. C. A. and Hawaiian Pines. The Pines are replacing the Iwileis, who are reported as not entering a team this year.

The Theo. H. Davies, Ltd., has offered a silver cup to the championship team. The present plans are to play the series downtown, using the Central "Y" court on Tuesday nights and the Service "Y" court on Thursday nights. Doubleheader will be played at each court.

The official schedule will be drawn at a meeting of the league to be held next Tuesday at 7 p. m. at the Central "Y" building, in room 7. Entry blanks may be secured from Chairman Field or A. A. Kempa.

The A. A. U. is also forming a secondary senior volleyball league. This takes care of all players not on the first team. There are eight teams entered and the competition, according to Field, will be in two sections. In the first section will be Palama A. team, Firemen A team, Central "Y" and University of Hawaii. In section two, there will be the Palama B team, the Firemen B team, Kalihi A. C.s and Outrigger Canoe club.

Prizes are being secured for champions in this league, Field said. All games in this league will be played at the Palama gymnasium, where two doubleheaders are expected to be staged one evening.

All men teams are not allowed to have more than 10 players.

The women's volleyball league is also attracting wide attention. Teams entered are: Palama Settlement, Kalihi A. C., Hawaiian Pines, Outrigger Canoe club and Uluilina club. More details of this league will be made known later.
