

Fire Department Favored to Cop 1929 Senior A. A. U. Volleyball

Theo. H. Davies Puts Up Cup To Championship Team; Central 'Y,' Nuuanu 'Y' and Pines Listed As 'Dark Horse' Entries; Palama, 1928 Champs, Weak On Paper

Tonight marks the 1929 opening of the local senior volleyball season. The senior A. A. U. league will operate all its games in town, games being played at the Central "Y" on Tuesday nights and and the new Army-Navy "Y" on Friday nights.

The secondary league will play but once a week at the Palama gymnasium on Thursdays when a quartet of games will be reeled off.

Tonight the senior A. A. U. league games will be: Palama vs. Nuuanu "Y" at 7 p. m. and A. C. A. vs. Firemen at 8 p. m.

Friday night's A. A. U. league program will be: Outrigger C. C. vs. Hawaiian Pines at 7 p. m. and Palama vs. Central "Y."

Ten teams are entered in the secondary league. They are: Firemen, Kalihi club, Palama, Hawaiian Pines and A. C. A.s, composing the section B circuit and Normal school, Palama, Firemen, Outrigger and Central "Y" the A section.

To the championship team the fire department will donate a trophy. The Theo. H. Davies is donating a cup to the winners of the A. A. U. league race.

Are Favored

The Firemen outfit is being regarded as the coming A. A. U. championship team. The team has improved in general strength and the losses have been few. The Palama Settlement team, last year's champion, is not looked upon as title winners, but will be a dangerous team to fool with. The loss of four players in Louis Morton, James Fujii, Charles Naiwi and K. F. ("Maggle") Chow will be keenly felt.

E. P. Boyle is manager of the fire department outfit. Henry Kipi, William Kamai, J. R. Sylva, R. T. McCabe, M. Barrett, D. Kaopuiki, E. Kealoha, A. Wright, F. Maunakea and V. Mokulehua are the "red-shirts" who will do the feeding and slamming for the "hook and ladder" outfit this season.

One of the strongest teams in the league this year is that entered by Coach Merrill Porter of Central Y. M. C. A., whose aggregation finished next in line to the Palamas last season. Capt. Karratti, Alex McLellan and Thomas Pickard compose the squad which is a formidable one and has been in training for some time.
