The real purpose of this conference in New York will never be known, as it was a personal problem and situation between two organizations. It was a matter of personal adjustment between two large athletic bodies, both seeking and aiming towards the same goal, namely the promotion of clean amateur sports. Perhaps this meeting did not bring out what it originally had planned, but there is no doubt that the bitter antagonistic feeling which existed between these two bodies will be buried and forgotten and the future will find more friendly and better understanding for everybody.

New President

The newly elected president of the A. A. U. is without doubt one of the most progressive men ever to hold office. Being a prominent athlete himself, a former member of the American Olympic track team, his college career was most colorful. As a member of the University of Illinois track team, he became a most popular all-around man in college history. In 1914, 1916, 1918 he won the all-around title and finished fifth in the pentathlon at the 1911 games at Stockholm. He is at the present time a very successful business man, being one of the outstanding contractors in Chicago. He knows the athletic situation better than any man in the game because of his varied experiences as president of the alumni association of the Big Ten, first vice president of the A. A. U. for three years and other experiences.

He probably understands conditions much better than any president who has ever held office. The entire athletic body and organizations are vitally interested in his
