Harrison is the main cog in these two teams and his absence will be keenly felt. Coach Parker is not saying anything but: "If only De Mello was back."

During the trials yesterday, the coaches of the various teams picked their lanes for the various relays and also placed their men in the semi-final heats which will be run off tomorrow.
