UNIVERSITY GETS SECOND; THREE RECORDS BROKEN

Cerny Lowers His Own Mark for the 2-Mile While Hung Wai Ching Slashes Long Standing Hurdles Record—Elinor Wong Runs 60-yard in 71.5 Seconds—Ventura of Maui Takes 440 Dash in Slow Time

THE Army track and field team, inspired by Frank Cerny, "Schofield Express," created no mild sensation at Kamehameha field yesterday when they romped off with the honors in the annual A. A. U. championships. The Doughboys amassed a total of 46 points to wrench the laurels from the University of Hawaii squad which finished second with 35 points. The highly touted Palama aggregation was third with 30 points, Nuuanu Y "Four Horsemen" fourth with 21, Outrigger fifth with 20 and Maui sixth with 12 digits.

Three records fell by the boards, Frank Cerny crashing the two mile, Hung Wai Ching of Nuuanu Y lowering the 220-yard hurdles and Elinor Wong besting the 60-yard dash for girls.

CHING BIG STAR

Hung Wai Ching of Nuuanu Y not only defeated Ray Melim in the 220-hurdles for a new record but also carried off places in three other events to grab the individual point honors for the day with a total of 18 1/2 markers. He won the broad jump, finished second in the 100 and 220 dashes, ran anchor on the Y relay team which placed third and clipped 4-5 of a second off of John Watt's record for the hurdles.

Frank Cerny stepped like a scared hare in the 2-mile to lower his former mark of 10 minutes 53-5 seconds by 4 1-5 seconds. The "Schofield Express" started with the gun to test the record and his only change of pace came in the last 150 yards when he launched a brilliant spurt that carried him to the tape to a new triumph. It was his second first place of the day, as he carried off the laurels in the mile run.

The only other mark to fall was bettered by Eleanor Wong of Normal school in the 60-dash for girls. Miss Wong nosed out P. C. Lum of Kalihi to cut 3-5 of a second off of her old record.

VENTURA WINS 440

The feature race of the day, the 440 dash was won by Johnny Ventura, Maui dash. The Lahainalua crack overtook Jones of the Army on the stretch to grab the laurels. Al Giles of the University was boxed at the 220 mark but got loose on the homestretch to figure in a brilliant finish. The time was much of a disappointment, Ventura being clocked in 53 2-5 seconds.

Jones of the Army fagged himself out in the early part of the race when he bucked a strong wind on the first turn.

The 880 run went to Lindsay of the University, who led Cole of the Army to the tape.

WAKETAKE TAKES TWO

Waketake, crack Varsity sprinter won the 100 and 220 dashes. He negotiated the 100 in 10 flat, leading Hung Wai Ching to the tape by fully 2 1/2 yards. In the 220, Ching was again his rival. His time was 22 1-5 seconds, 1-5 slower than Teddy Hair's record.

The Dean flash carried the stick in the half-mile relay to first honors to close a big day.

BAD BREAK

A tough break robbed the highly

touted Maui half-mile relay team of a place in the final event of the program. The Mauites might have taken first honors. Madame Fate frowned on them at the final pass. Billie Mountcastle after a brilliant lap, fell as he was about to pass the stick to Silva. University, Nuuanu Y and Maui were about even.
