

# LITTLE CORPORAL FROM SCHOFIELD LOWERS OLD MARK

Nather of Gimlets Is Second, Aubree, Luke Field Athlete Finishes Third in Annual A. C. A. Classic —Old Record Shattered by 384-5 Seconds

**FRANK CERNEY**, greatest long-distance star of Hawaii, will be leaving the islands soon but the doughboy's name will not be forgotten for a long while.

Yesterday morning, the Schofield runner won the A. C. A. (All-around Chinese Athletes) eighth annual five-mile marathon race in what he termed "his farewell" appearance, creating a new record for the distance from the foot of the Aloha Tower to the Alawai Bridge. The time was 26 min 46 seconds, bettering his old mark of 27 min. 25 seconds established in 1927 by 384-5 seconds.

Eddie Nather, of the 21st Infantry yards. He maintained his sturdy gallop into Kalakaua avenue with Nather outdistancing Aubree and Verehardt. The latter injured his foot and had to abandon the race. Cole was running fourth with Fowler in fifth and Helbush in sixth places. They had all strung out and were separated from each other by the minimum of 100 yards.

**VETERAN IS FIFTH**

With the soldier-boys taking most of the honors, the civilians had to be contented to take what was left. A. P. Helbush, who is about 35 years old, came in strongly. He was running under the Outrigger C. C. colors. Lieut. D. M. Fowler, of the 27th Infantry, was sixth.

About 25 starters went off with the starting gun, fired by Sheriff Pat Gleason at 9:25 a. m. and sixteen of them reached the finish.

**STIFF PACE**

Cerney surged to the front with the crack of the gun and set a terrific pace. In the first fifty yards he had taken a ten yards lead of his rivals, and he kept his killing pace to the tape. Continuing his steady stride, Cerney passed the mile mark 150 yards ahead of Verehardt, who had Ed Nather and Aubree running close behind him. Nearing the Ala Moana Bridge, the "Schofield Express" increased his leeway to 200

The victor increased the gap to about 225 yards as they swung into Makee Road from Kalakaua avenue. Aubree was about four hundred yards behind Nather. Turning into the Alawai Boulevard, Cerney sprinted the last 300 yards to the finish in front of the Alawai bridge leading into the Fair Grounds while an enthusiastic throng applauded his performance.

**PRIZES PRESENTED**

After the race, the victors were awarded with cups and medals. Mrs. Clarence Chang, Mrs. Kan Heen Lum, Mrs. E. Fullard-Leo and Miss Edith Jorice aided in the presentations. Cerney was given the Chinese-American Bank cup and has one leg on the All-Around Chinese Athletes' three year cup. Ed Nather got the Dr. Fred K. Lam trophy for second place while the Acme Auto Company silver cup was won by Aubree. Cole, Helbush and Fowler will be given silver medals donated by Dr. F. D'Eliscu.
