

SURFBOARD RACES BY CITYWIDERS NOW ON SUNDAY

Meet Slated For Tomorrow Postponed To Not Inter- fere With O. C. C. Swims

The first annual Citywide surfboard paddling contests will be held at 2 p. m. Sunday on the Ala Wai, near the fair grounds bridge. The races were originally scheduled for Thanksgiving Day, but the Recreation commission, under whose auspices the races are being held, decided that the events would interfere with the Outrigger Canoe club's big swim.

The commission has announced that those entrants desiring transportation for their boards to the scene of the races notify Art Powlison, superintendent of recreation, who will make as many trips as necessary with the playgrounds truck from the "stone wall," near Waikiki Inn and the Outrigger club.

A feature of the meet will be the attempt by Tom Blake to lower the Hawaiian and the world's record for the 100-yard surfboard paddling. Blake, with his "cigar" board, has unofficially clipped some time off the existing records.

The events follow:

100 yards for boys under 13.

100 yards for boys under 15.

100 yards for boys under 18.

100 yards for boys under 21.

$\frac{1}{2}$ mile for boys under 18.

$\frac{1}{2}$ mile for boys over 18.

$\frac{1}{4}$ mile for boys under 18.

$\frac{1}{4}$ mile for boys over 18.

100 yards men's open.

100 yards men over 30.

100 yards girls under 15.

100 yards girls' open.

100 yards relay.

Ribbons will be awarded for first four places in each event.
