

Teams Compete In Surf Board Polo Tomorrow

First of Series Opens In
Front of Royal Hawaiian
Hotel At 3:30 P. M.

Surfboard water polo, a sport which was begun last year, and one peculiar to Hawaii, will be resumed at Waikiki Sunday at 3:30 p. m., when teams of the Outrigger Canoe club and the Hui Nalu club will compete.

Two games are planned, there being two teams from each club. They will be the first of a series in which these two clubs and the Queen's Surfriders, a new beach club, will compete for a trophy offered by Arthur Benaglia, general manager of the Territorial Hotel Co. Members of the winning team will receive individual trophies.

A committee consisting of Duke Kahanamoku, chairman; David Kahanamoku, C. K. Amalu, G. D. ("Dad") Center, J. R. Farrington and C. S. Cost, has charge of arrangements for the tournament.

In order to accommodate the crowd, which last year included a large number of persons, bleachers will be erected on the promenade in front of the hotel and a small charge will be made for these seats, all of which will be reserved. This does not prevent the public from watching the competition from other points of vantage without any cost.

The game will take place in front of the Royal Hawaiian hotel as was done last year.

An additional event will be a surfboard race from the Moana pier to a point opposite the farthest groin. This will be open to all competitors and probably will take place between the two polo games.
