OUTRIGGER CLUB GIVES PRELIMINARY CHOWDER AT BEACH

There was a chowder at the Outrigger Club last night to the directors and the entertainment committee and invited guests. It was a sample of what the big chowder next month is to be. General Macomb moved that it was the best chowder he had ever tasted, and the motion was unanimously carried with the fourth bowl, and Francis J. Each of the entertainment committee has a list of club members he is to call on and secure the underwriting of the tickets. The entertainment will last from two in the afternoon until midnight. In the afternoon there will be all kinds of canoeing and surfing events and the Clark cups will be contested for if this does not interfere with entries for the regattas, in which case the cup contests will have to be postponed, as the entertainment is for the club. From five to seven the chowder will be served under the hau tree grove and from seven until midnight there will be a dance in the big lanai; it is possible that there will be a young folks dance after the races until eight o'clock. The tickets for the entire day, races, chowder and dance, will be a dollar.
