

Carnival Swimming Meet Will Be Held At Y.M.C.A. This Year

Plan to Stage Meet at Waikiki Abandoned—Carnival Committee Arranges With Association for Use of Pool on Two Days—W. T. Rawlins Will Have Charge of Meet—Outrigger Club, Palama, Healanis and Other Organizations Will Enter

At a meeting of the Carnival directors yesterday it was decided not to stage the big Carnival swimming meet at the Outrigger Club, and arrangements have been made to stage the aquatic events at the Y. M. C. A. tank. The Carnival committee has appointed W. T. Rawlins to handle the meet.

A. E. Larimer said this morning that the Carnival committee would be given the use of the tank on any day they desired, and the committee has planned to stage the various events on Thursday, February 21, and Saturday, February 23. These are tentative dates.

Waikiki Plan Abandoned

George Angus, chairman of the Carnival committee said that after considering the plan to hold a meet at Waikiki it was found that the cost of erecting substantial bleachers together with the fact that the races would be staged many yards away, caused the committee to vote against staging the affair at the beach.

Both Larimer and Jackson have said that they would be pleased to assist in any way, and the fact that the association has donated the tank for the use of the Carnival committee, shows the interest in sport that is a feature of the activities at the Y. M. C. A.

Rawlins has been ill for the past few days, but other A. A. U. members have been working on plans for a meet, and it is known that the Out-

rigger and Palama will enter. J. Brooks Brown of Palama Settlement has announced that Palama has a number of swimmers in training for the coming meet.
