

OAHU VOLLEYBALL LEAGUE ORGANIZED

Eight Teams Entered and Play
Begins At "Y" On
April 8

Last evening in the directors room of the Y. M. C. A., the representatives of the various athletic organizations met for the second time and a schedule of volleyball games was presented and adopted. Officers were elected and details of various kinds presented and handled. S. W. Robley was elected president and Ben Clark was chosen secretary and treasurer.

Considerable difficulty was encountered in getting competent referees but this problem was satisfactorily disposed of when Glenn E. Jackson and J. C. Fatt volunteered to handle all of the games between them. The Oahu Volleyball League is indeed fortunate in obtaining the services of these two men, who are local authorities on the game and are both giving their services gratis.

A. A. U. Cards Required

It was also decided that all of the players should obtain A. A. U. cards and thereby eliminate any chance of involving the amateur standing of any players already members of the A. A. U. The members of the league have all been furnished O. O. U. cards by S. W. Robley.

All of the gate receipts and income derived from the games played will be given to the Red Cross, single admissions being fixed at fifteen cents and season tickets at one dollar.

Each one of the teams entering will pay an entrance fee of two dollars and all of the games will be governed by the official rules of the Spaulding Rule Book.

All games will be played in the games hall of the Y. M. C. A.
