FLAG HAS 125 NAMES

Presentation Will Take Place Tomorrow

More than a hundred and twenty-five names of Outrigger Club members have been worked on the service flag to be presented to the Outrigger Club tomorrow afternoon by the Pan-Pacific Union. Mrs. Raymond C. Brown is chairman of the ladies' committee in charge of the flag and it has been quite an undertaking, as in addition to the 125 names it is likely that another seventy-five will be woven on the big flag before the war is over.

W. R. Castle will present the flag for the Pan-Pacific Union and Sanford B. Dole will receive it for the Outrigger Club. The Royal Hawaiian Band will play patriotic airs from five to six tomorrow afternoon on the Outrigger grounds during the ceremonies. President Chase of the Outrigger Club says that if the day is fair the big service flag will be unveiled against the large pavilion, and if it be rainy the unveiling will take place within. The friends and relatives of Outrigger members who are wearing the khaki are invited to be at the Outrigger grounds at five tomorrow afternoon in memory of the end of the first year of our participation in the world war for democracy, and in remembrance of the club members who are taking part in the actual conflict for freedom.
