

PLANS FOR ENTERTAINMENT OF LANE BY PAN-PACIFIC UNION PROGRESS

Plans are progressing for the proposed Pan-Pacific entertainment for Secretary Franklin K. Lane.

Yesterday the Japanese met and selected their speaker, Dr. Iga Mori. They have designed a flag for the occasion, which will represent the Pacific Japanese Association. Every club and organization is invited to display its emblem, for at the proposed banquet (to be held at the Mid-Pacific Institute) there will be a table for each club in the city.

Possibly the ancient flag of China may be seen again in Honolulu if the Chinese Historical Society selects this as its emblem, as the Korean Students' Alliance has selected the ancient flag of Korea as its emblem.

The Sons and Daughters of the American Revolution will present the American flag and the native sons of

California will sit under the Bear flag, while the Filipino society will gather about the Rising Sun flag.

The Outrigger Club will utilize its service flag of 150 stars, and a number of other clubs are selecting appropriate emblems, as this will be the first Pan-Honolulu gathering of every race, nation and club in the city, for all are expected to be represented.

A pageant of Pacific races will precede this banquet, the grounds of the Mid-Pacific Institute lending themselves splendidly to this. A luncheon meeting of the club and racial delegates will be held at the Young hotel Friday noon, when it is expected the completed plans for the entertainment will be ready to place in the hands of the committee in charge of the reception to Secretary Lane.
