

Outrigger Women Oppose Sylphlike Displays On Beach

The women's auxiliary of the Outrigger Club is preparing a communication to the board of supervisors against the "outrigging" of those feminine disciples of surfing and beach adornment who believe, when the question of swimming clothes arises, that the slogan of "the fewer the better" should prevail.

Single-piece bathing suits, when worn by young women who spend more time on the beach than in the water, have aroused the indignation of the feminine membership of the club, and it is against such garments, and others cut too high or too low—as the case may be—that the protest is to be aimed.

Upwards of two thousand women are expected to sign the petition to the supervisors which will urge an ordinance compelling women bathers and beachers to wear costumes with skirts reaching to just above the knee and with neck covering reaching to a point within four inches of the esophagus.
