## Resolution Adopted Favoring Regulation of Feminine Bathing Costumes

The question of regulation of costumes for women bathers at Waikiki beach, which has occupied considerable space in the public prints during the current week, still waxes warm. In reply to a published statement to the effect that the Outrigger Canoe Club was not in sympathy with its women's auxiliary, which desires to have the board of supervisors pass an ordinance regulating the bathing attire of Waikiki mermaids, Mrs. Arthur G. Smith, of the Women's Auxiliary, submits the following resolution adopted June 18, by the directors and received by her from W. H. Soper, secretary of the outrigger organization, as indicating the desire of the men of the club to regulate bathing costumes:

"Resilved, that we object to the indiscriminate walking on the streets of men and women clad in bathing suits without any outer covering, and that we are also very much in favor of some ordinance being passed requiring that proper bathing suits be worn by women bathers."

"I might add," Mr. Soper said in a letter, "that although there was some considerable discussion with regard to the details to be embodied in such an ordinance, still the motion as a whole was unanimously adopted."

Mrs. Smith further avers that Mayor Fern, who yesterday deprecated any attempt to present such a "trivial" matter before the board of supervisors, would change his mind when the matter was properly presented to him.
