

Young Honolulu Is Scout Pilot, Flying in France

Lieut. R. Alexander Anderson, son of Dr. and Mrs. R. W. Anderson, of this city (who received his aeronautical training at the ground school at Ithaca, New York, is now in France with the American aviation corps.

After receiving his initial training in New York he was sent to England, and following six months' instruction received his commission as a first lieutenant of the signal reserve corps, American section.

His duty in France is that of a scout pilot, which is one of the most dangerous of all aviation occupations. In a letter just received from him by his parents he gives the highest praise to the thoroughness of the English methods of training aviators.

Lieutenant Anderson was graduated from Punahou Academy in 1912. Immediately after being graduated from Cornell a year ago he enlisted in the United States army.
