Duke Kahanamoku Establishes New Record In Sixty Yards

Swims Distance In Chicago In Twenty-five and Onefifth Seconds

CHICAGO, July 13—(Associated Press)—Using his inimitable crawl stroke, which was the marvel of the big crowd which witnessed the performance, Duke P. Kahanamoku swam sixty yards here last night in twenty-five and one-fifth seconds. This established a new record for the distance.

The only reference to a sixtyyard record to be found in the World's Almanac gives C. M. Daniels the time of thirty seconds, flat, made in a twenty-yard tank, with two turns, at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, on December 19, 1907.

Duke last night bettered this time by four and four-fifths seconds.

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
