

HAWAII THEATER TO START BATHING SUIT CONTEST TOMORROW

The Hawaii theater is going to have a bathing suit contest, starting tomorrow night, and Manager Johnnie Carroll is confident that it will prove to be one of the most successful stunts pulled off at that playhouse.

The idea is to have the young ladies of the city appear in bathing suits of their own creation or choice—those that they ordinarily wear at the beach or which they think most appropriate for swimming at Waikiki.

The girls will not appear in person but will be present on the screen for it is the plan to have moving pictures taken of such as desire to enter the contest. Manager Carroll says that he will send a moving picture man to the beach to take movies of such as desire to compete. He says, also, that the Ladies' Auxiliary of the Outrigger Club, which has protested against some of the bathing suits worn at the beach, has agreed to enter three models in order to demonstrate the kind of bathing suits it considers appropriate. All of the girls' swimming clubs, he says, will also enter models, as will all the stores selling bathing suits.

Three prizes, of \$25, \$10 and \$5, are offered for the three best models shown, the winners to be selected by popular vote of the spectators. The contest is open to all young women.
