The senior women's surfboard contest was postponed again owing to a number of the intended entries being suffers from the prevailing grippe. The events were postponed from last November.

In the senior men's surfboard contest, in which a good deal of skill had to be used owing to a strong off-shore wind which was blowing yesterday morning, making it difficult for the contestants to keep on the wave, David Kahanamoku, brother of the Duke, finished first, with Jack Mackenzie a

close second.

Some of the poses the contestants had to go through in this event were kneeling, standing in an erect position with the arms extended out from the body, standing with the back to the prow of the board, and lying prone on the board with the arms stretched out in front.

The body-surfing contest was won by Dixon Hitchcock, who finished ahead of Werner Smith by a close margin. S. W. Smythe of the United States Army Engineers, came third in this event.

Gold, silver and bronze medals were awarded for first, second and third places in both events.

Another surfing contest for junior members will be held shortly. At this time both senior and junior canoe-surfing will be a feature.
