Duke Kahanamoku May Enlist In U.S. Aviation Service

Duke Kahanamoku is going to Washington, D. C., to try to enter the aviation service, according to a letter received by A. H. Ford this morning from Joseph Stickncy, who is at the national capital, with a fair chance of being sent immediately to the aviation camp in North Carolina.

Young Stickney went direct from the Pan-Pacific Union in Honolulu to the Pan-American Union in Washington, and the officials of that body practically adopted the young volunteer from the kindred organization of the Pacific, so Stickney's headquarters are in the Pan-American marble palace in Washington, and his chances of entering the service he desires are good.

In Chicago, Stickney ran upon Duke and the Hawaiian swimmers at lunch in the bathrooms of the Chicago Athletic Club and there was a reunion, and it was then that Duke announced his intention of going on to the national capital for the purpose of entering the aviation service.
