

# HONOLULANS SHOW WAY TO SWIMMERS

## Duke Makes New Record and Kruger and Lane Win Their Events With Ease

NEW YORK, August 8—(Associated Press)—Hawaiian swimmers, cleared of all charges of professionalism by the Amateur Athletic Union swept all before them at the meet last night, Duke Kahanamoku being in especially fine form and establishing a new world's record at 125 yards. The Hawaiian swimmers were given a remarkable ovation and their victories were enthusiastically applauded, all being popular in spite of the defeat of local contestants.

In the 125-yard swim Kahanamoku led all the way, drawing fast, away from the field and finishing far ahead in one minute, twelve and four-fifths seconds. Leo Geible of New York was his closest competitor.

Harold Krueger, swimming backstroke easily defeated King and Troensgard of Brooklyn in a mixed match for 100 yards, time one minute, eight and three-fifths seconds.

Lane easily defeated Ted Reilly of New York at fifty yards, time twenty-four and four-fifths seconds.
