

Duke In Trouble Over Photographs? Here's a New One

Here's a new angle in the charges of professionalism against the Hawaiian swimmers on a Red Cross tour—charges that have been apparently entirely cleared away for the boys are swimming under A. A. U. auspices. The coast papers published the following telegraphic item:

CHICAGO, July 30.—Duke Kahanamoku, the noted Hawaiian swimmer, and Clarence Lane and Harold Kruger, also from the islands, may be barred from exhibiting their skill in the central states again if charges under investigation by officials of the Central A. A. U. are substantiated.

Charles A. Dean, president of the National A. A. U., and Fred L. Steers, chairman of the central registration committee, announced tonight that the Hawaiian trio are alleged to have "padded" their expense account of \$950 on their recent twelve-day tour of five cities in the Middle West. The officials charge that Kahanamoku declined to pose for a newspaper photographer, giving his reason that a certain motion picture company had the only rights for photographs.
