

KAHANAMOKU SHATTERS ANOTHER WORLD'S MARK

NEW YORK, N. Y., Aug. 20.—
Duke P. Kahanamoku, the Hawaiian swimming champion, swam 120 yards in one minute seven and two-fifths seconds, breaking his own record. He swam from scratch. Lane of Honolulu finished first.

Hawaii's wonder swimmer clipped a few seconds from the world's record for the 120 yards in New York last night but lost the race, Clarence Lane having been given a start. Evidently the Duke was striving to equal the handicap set and in the effort shattered the record. The previous time was one minute eight and two-fifths seconds for a tank held by McGilivray and the open water time was a minute and thirteen seconds held by C. R. Durgan.

Just how much of a handicap was given the message does not state, but evidently it was one that was fair enough to make the Duke exert himself to overcome.
