

BIG SWIMMING MATCH IS SET FOR NEW YORK

Duke, Ross and McGillivary to Go Over 220-yard Course is Gotham Plan

Duke Kahanamoku, world-famous swimmer; Perry McGillivary of Great Lakes Naval Station, and Norman Ross, erstwhile Olympic Club natator, now a lieutenant in the U. S. aviation service, have each been invited to compete in a 225-yard swim to be held in New York in the near future.

McGillivary appears to have the edge on the other two swimmers, by his recent performance when he defeated our great Duke in a record-smashing 220-yard race. Of course, McGillivary was forced to the time by Duke who will undoubtedly do it again if they meet in New York. But the Great Lakes "idol" will have to break his own record to get away from Ross and Duke. Kahanamoku holds all world records from 50 to 200 yards, but his specialty is the 100. The 220 is not his distance.

Ross, on the other hand, is unbeatable in the distances over 220 yards, and has proved it by his wins over the best in the country and annihilating records simultaneously. McGillivary's specialty is the 220.
