

WILL T. RAWLINS REELECTED HEAD OF LOCAL A. A. U.

President William T. Rawlins of the Hawaiian branch of the A. A. U. was reelected yesterday afternoon at a meeting of the association in the rooms of the president. Other officers elected were: George H. Dyson, vice president; Mrs. L. Fullard Leo, secretary-treasurer, and John F. Soper, chairman of the registration committee. Glenn E. Jackson and W. T. Rawlins were elected the other two members of the registration committee. Ben Clarke, who was a member of this committee, declined to accept the position any longer, the place going to President Rawlins.

The request made by Harvey Chilton that his Hui Makani club be admitted to the A. A. U. was turned down by a vote of six to one. Lorrin Andrews stated that Chilton was a trouble-maker and that his club has no clubhouse of any kind.

J. Ashman Beaven, representing the Oahu-Service Athletic League, urged mutual cooperation between his organization and the A. A. U. A committee of three—Lorrin Andrews, George Dyson and Ben Clarke—was then appointed by the president to study the proposition and report on the proposal of Mr. Beaven.

It was decided at the meeting that there will be no championship swimming races this year, due to war conditions prohibiting the use of the naval slip. The board of managers of the association was then elected as follows:
