

Will Dance To Help Swimmers In the Mainland

Outrigger Canoe Club, Hui Nalu and Others Come To Aid of Lane and Kruger

Honoluluans will have an opportunity to help out in a good cause by turning out to the dance which will be given at 8 o'clock tonight in the Outrigger Canoe Club pavilion on the beach at Waikiki.

The dance has been arranged by William T. Rawlins, president of the Hawaiian Association of the A. A. U., and Capt. "Dad" Center, athletic director of the Outrigger Canoe Club, and the proceeds will go toward helping Clarence Lane and Harold "Stubby" Kruger, the two Hawaiian swimmers who were recently left ill and stranded in the East following the late Red Cross benefit tour of the mainland.

Music for the dance will be furnished by the Hui Nalu orchestra, which is one of the most famous in the land. Tickets, admitting gentleman and lady, are selling at a dollar each and may be had at the pavilion before the dance. Every cent will go to aid the two boys on the mainland.

Mr. Rawlins started a subscription recently to raise \$800 and with the amount to be realized tonight he feels that there will be enough to cable the sum immediately to New York.
